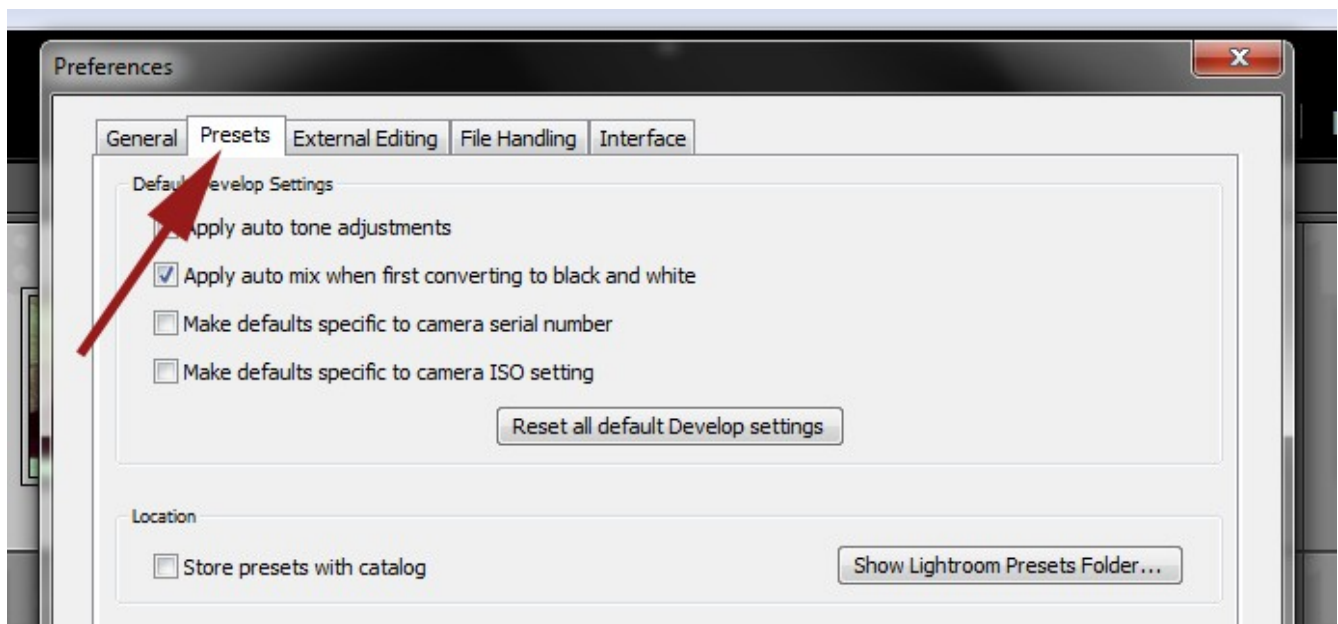

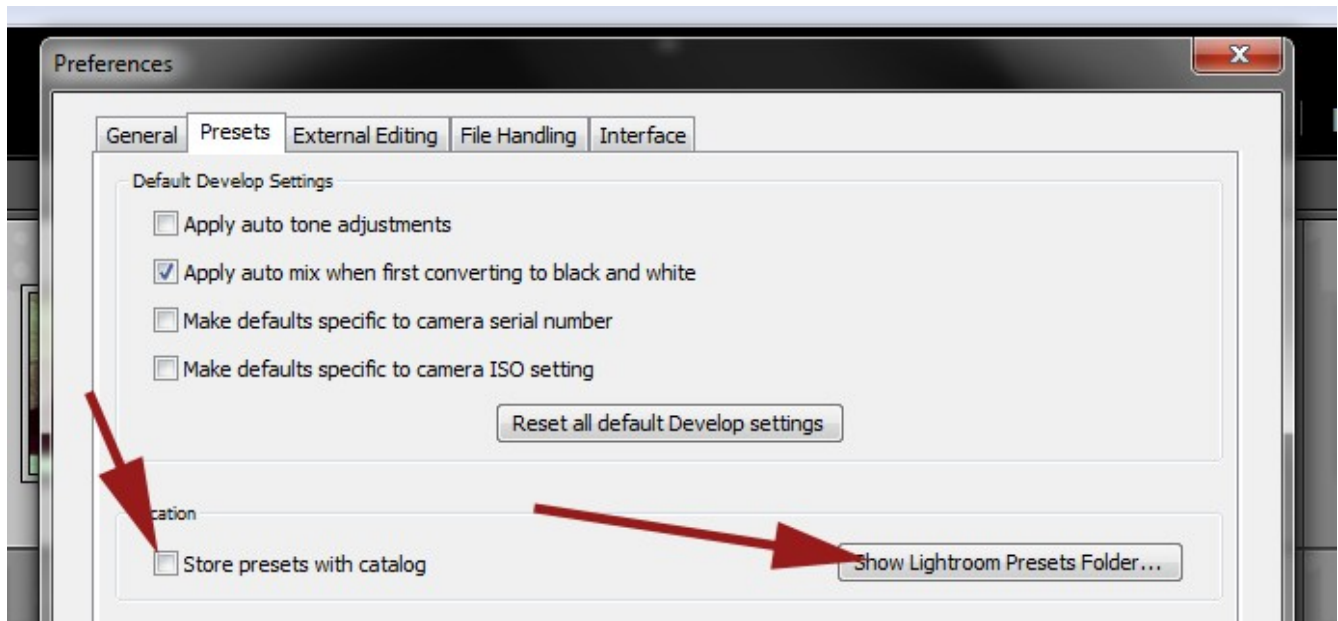
## Installing Presets

In order to use the presets in Lightroom they must be properly installed. Please follow these steps:

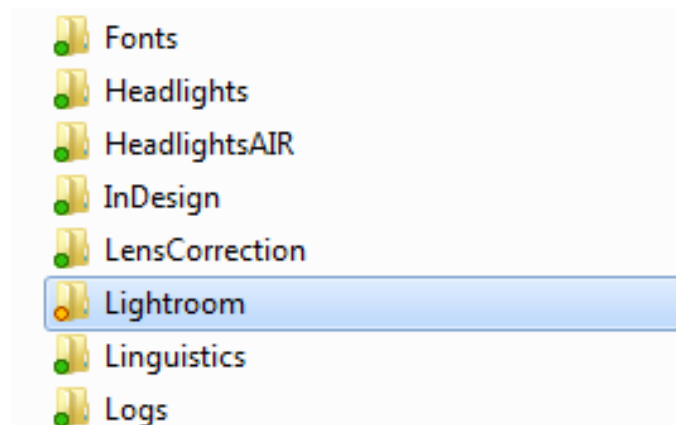
1. If you're reading this documentation file then you have already downloaded the product zip file. Hopefully you have already saved the downloaded files somewhere on your computer, but if you haven't, please do so now. Inside the zip file you will find this documentation PDF file, a product license PDF file, and a folder (or multiple folders) that includes the preset files.
2. Open Lightroom. Go to Edit > Preferences (Lightroom > Preferences for Mac users). Click on the "Presets" tab.



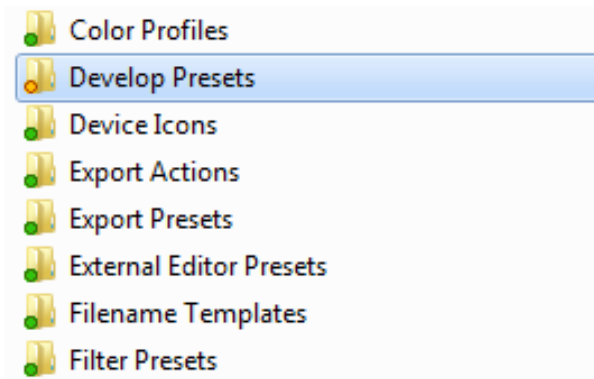
3. Make sure the “Store presets with catalog” box is unchecked. Click on “Show Lightroom Presets Folder”.



4. This will open a popup window. Open the “Lightroom” folder.

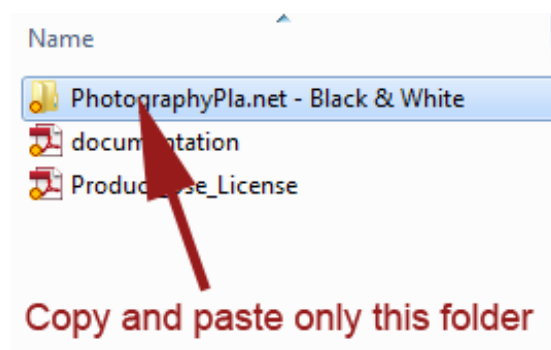


5. Open the “Develop Presets” folder.



If you haven't installed any presets previously you will only see the “user presets” folder here.

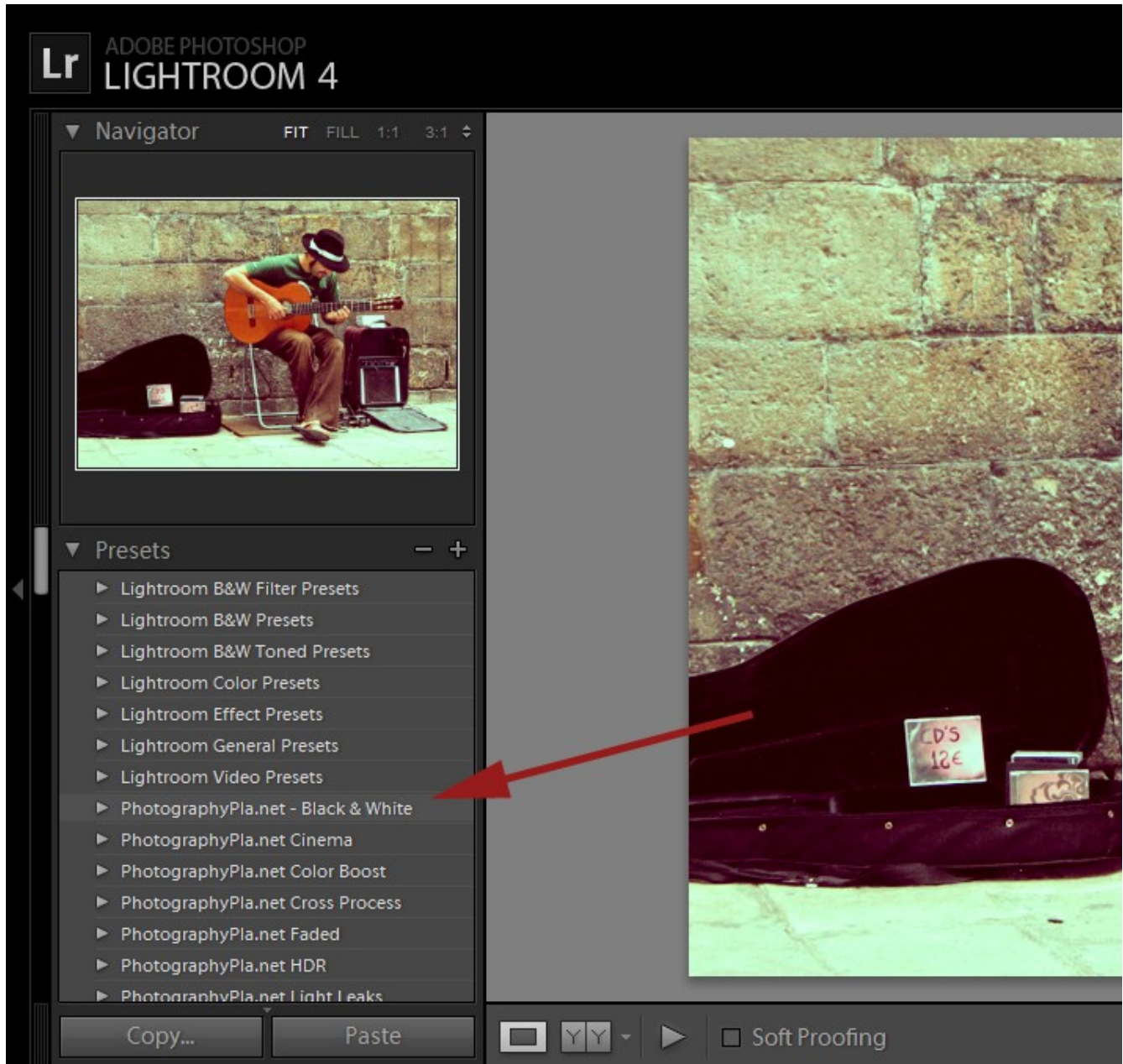
6. Copy the folder of the presets that you purchased and paste that folder into the “Develop Presets” folder. The folder you are pasting should include nothing but the preset files. For example, if you are installing our Black and White Presets you would copy and paste the folder called “PhotographyPla.net – Black & White”.



7. Close Lightroom and then open it again and the presets will be installed.

## Using the Presets

To use the presets, first make sure that you are in the Develop module of Lightroom. You'll see the presets options at the left side of your screen, and you will see the name of whichever preset sets you have installed.



Click the arrow to the left of the name to open the set. Then click on the name of any of the presets to apply it to the photo.

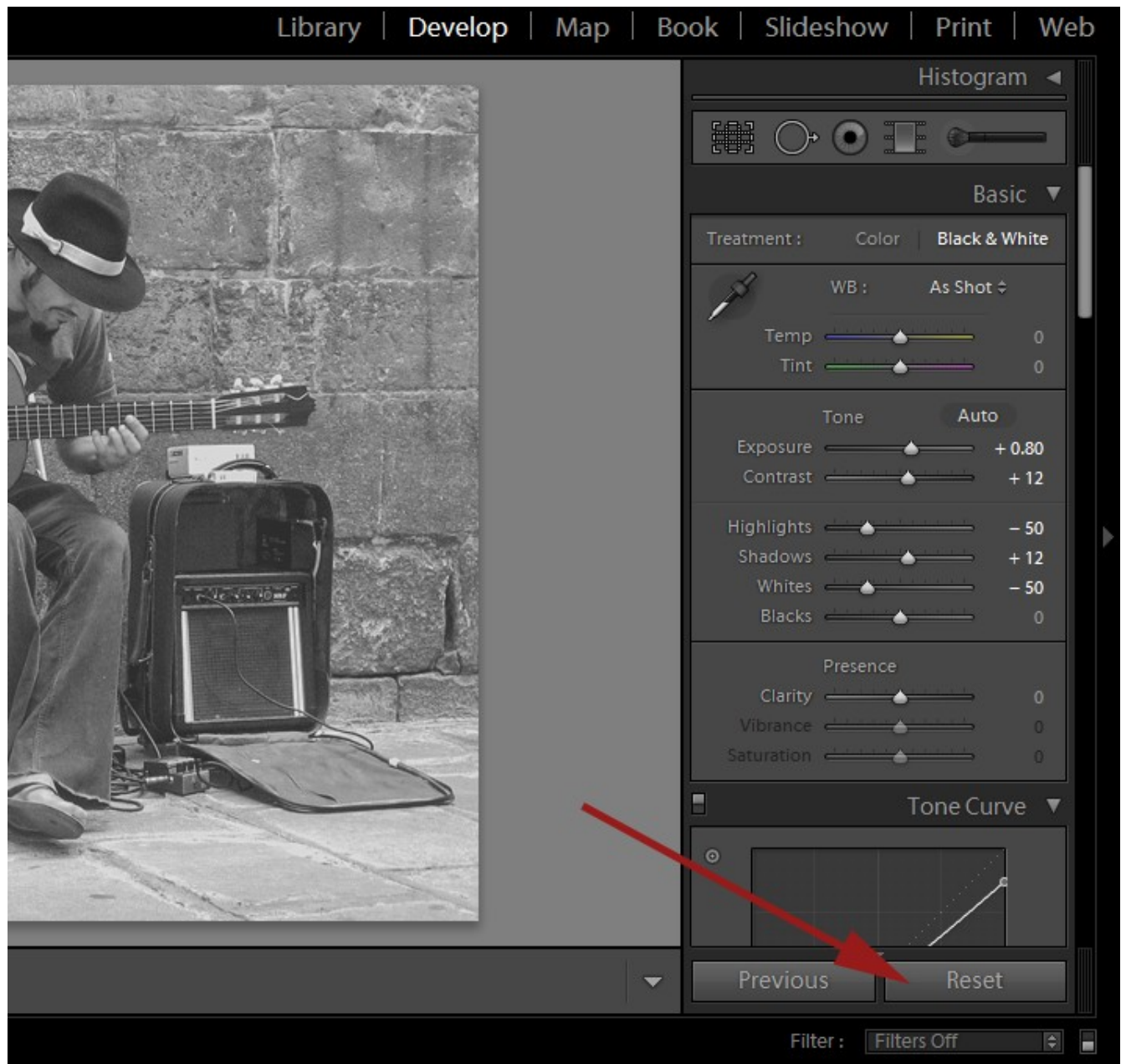
